

Children With Medical Complexity

A child's condition is considered to be medically complex if they are in two or more of these categories:

- Having one or more chronic health conditions associated with significant morbidity or mortality.
- Belonging to a high-risk or vulnerable population with functional limitations impacting their ability to perform activities of daily living (ADLs).
- Having high health care needs or utilization patterns, including requiring three or more subspecialties, therapists, or surgeries.
- Having a continuous dependence on technology to overcome functional limitations and maintain a basic quality of life.
